### POLICY UPDATES

#### Policy 2.2 – Patrol Requirements

The Board has endorsed proposed changes to Policy 2.2 as summarised below.

- **Active Reserve Requirements** – Policy amended to provide that hours completed by Age Group Managers and Water Safety to count towards Active Reserve requirements.

Pursuant to section 25.1 of the Constitution a 21-day notice period to members must be provided before the above changes are formally ratified. A copy of the draft amended policy can be located on the club [website](#).

#### Policy 1.1 - Membership Categories

The Board has previously endorsed and published proposed changes to Policy 6.1 as summarised below.

- **Access to Club Buildings** – Policy amended to include membership categories permitted to apply for an access fob, and limit of one fob per member.

Following completion of the 21-day notice period to members, the Board has adopted the amended Policy 6.1.

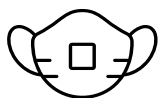
### Nipper Gold Table & Awards night

There were seven (7) Board members present so a quorum existed.

## Summary of Decisions

---

- 9 February 2022 full minutes – **endorsed** by those present.
- 9 February 2022 summary minutes – **endorsed** by those present.
- It was noted that the following resolution in respect of Policy 1.1 was passed by Circular Resolution on 28 February 2022:  
**RESOLVE** that the attached updated Policy 1.1 – ‘Membership Categories’ be adopted and published on the Club Website.
- Bar Fridges – The Board **endorsed** inclusion of a steel infill panel above the planned new bar fridge.
- The Board discussed recent Government updates and the impact these would have on upcoming Club functions. Due to the requirement to provide a sit-down service, the State Titles Players Tea and After Party have been cancelled. The Board will consider an event post season subject to relaxation of COVID restrictions.
- Policy 6.1 – The Board **endorsed** proposed changes to Policy 6.1 ‘General Club Rules’ which have been updated to reflect categories of membership entitled to apply for and purchase an access fob. The proposed changes are to be published on the Club’s website in accordance with the Constitution.
- Pulse Survey – The Board **endorsed** an annual pulse survey to gauge member engagement and support against the ongoing delivery of the Club’s strategic plan.
- Annual Report – The proposed structure for the Annual Report was **endorsed**.
- Coaching Plan – Proposed Coaching Plan was tabled and the process to finalise and seek expressions of interest was **endorsed** by the Board.
