### R&R STATES STATES - Doug McGhie

#### Success at Sorrento – R&R States

Scarboro's R&R teams did the club proud at the Open States at Sorrento on Saturday March 20.

George Tolev and Jill Briggs took cards on the judging panel for the day and Nicole was often seen with a stopwatch in hand helping with the timekeeping where needed.

Many thanks to all of them.

With Tom so unfortunately unavailable this season, it was a last-minute call up for an experienced and suitably qualified hand to the Open Mixed 5 and 6 Person teams. Some quick negotiation saw Clint McGhie back in an R&R team about 20 years after his last competition. A quick training session

on the Friday morning before the event convinced the other team members he may have done it before and Clint was welcomed in.



The Championships began with the Under 15 2 Person, with Scarboro having three teams in the final. While missing the medals the six girls lowered there scores again and should all be medal prospects next year. The teams were Scarboro A with Lily Tolev and Charlotte Willemson-Burke (4.5 points), Scarboro B with Mia Dunn and Charlotte Hoy (4.0) and Scarboro C with Lily Sweeney and Amelie Watson (5.0). The first three places and medals went to the more experienced Sorrento teams, all three drilling an excellent 2.5 points, then separated on count back. Well done them, but we are not far off the pace after a very short training time for most of the girls. Medals can be anticipated here next year.

The Under 15 5 Person was our first success for the day with Charlotte Hoy taking the reserve role for the team and the other five cutting their score from their only other carnival by more than half. They placed third, their first Bronze medal, with 9.5 points. Now it's time to touch the golden table on Sunday night. Sorrento won with 3.5 (a great score, but by a team one year older than ours) and were also second with 6.5. We have room for



improvement, and it was coming quickly at the end of the season. Sorrento - look out - as we have you in our sights!

Then it was on to the Open teams. The Open Women's 5 Person event was impacted by a judging error that meant it had to be rerun and our ladies put up a great show, drilling just 4 points but losing another 1.3 on the swim. The result was a win for the experienced Sorrento with 3 points and second for Scarboro on 5.34. well clear of Mullaloo with 10.38 in third. This group will get a good feel of the golden table on Sunday night, running their hands along the whole length. Well done Kathy Brooks, Janet Stephenson, Tanya Channel, Cheryl Harry and Belinda Sommers.











Next to the mixed events.

In the 6 Person, Kathy Brooks took the patient swim, while Graham Jones (tube) shared the timed swims with Clint McGhie (belt). Apparently, the swims were a bit longer than hoped and we lost the swim total by 3 seconds (0.06 points). On the beach, we had Tanya on the reel and Cheryl and Belinda on the line. We were out drilled by three points on the beach and Sorrento (2.0) took gold, another silver to Scarboro (5.06), but getting to know that golden table again.

The Open Mixed 5 provided the highlight for the day. With Bob Welch as the patient, Graham in the Belt, Clint on the reel, Cheryl at first line and cardiac operator and Belinda as second-line and resuscitator a slick run through resulted, five sections had just one point and the other was clear. Graham was beaten in the swim by 7 seconds (0.14 points), but we out drilled Sorrento (6.0) by a full point and our 5.14 won gold, a fantastic result (initially, incorrectly presented silver – that picture here). Clint remarked that he did not feel he had over-trained and the whole team enjoyed the win, looking forward to walking the table on Sunday.

Two years ago, we had one 2 Person team compete in the Nipper States as our full effort in the R&R. In 2021 we had nine teams, seven made finals and we won four medals. Next year we have the Aussies at Scarborough and we can be very competitive in R&R. Talk to those who are already competing, and, whatever your age, if you see a place for you, give it a go. You will enjoy being in a team and have fun with your mates. Those who would like to look at coaching and officiating are also most welcome.

#### **BUSY DAY!**

Last Sunday was fine and sunny, but the swell kept building up during the morning. By mid-day, Bel KUSTER's patrol had carried out 7 rescues. Some very strong flash rips had developed and Carl Van HEEREN's afternoon patrol didn't have an IRB driver. Ella McCULLAGH volunteered and with Calvin CROESER as her crewman, gave an outstanding performance, driving in the very tricky conditions throughout the afternoon. They were backed up by Chris KUSTER on the jetski. During one mass rescue, Bernard WEIR was caught inside by a big wave and his rescue board was snapped in half. At one stage, almost all of the patrol was out in the water. The public on the beach were all standing up, watching. Overall over another dozen people were rescued during the afternoon.

A great effort and thanks to all concerned.!

This coming weekend will be the last of the patrols for the current season. Also the State Championships are being held on our beach at the same time. If you aren't competing, you can still represent the Club by coming down and doing a patrol. It is intended to position the patrol directly in front of the Club. This will give us access to Brighton beach and the carnival area.

For those who recently gained their awards, this will be the last chance to experience patrol operations and select a patrol to which you would like to be allocated. If you think you are too cool to wear a cap, please remember we will be under the scrutiny of members from all the other clubs. We do the most rescues on the most hazardous beach and I would like to leave the impression that this is the kind of club they could only hope to be in.
